Maturity Isn't a Butterfly

Unlike a butterfly that might land on your shoulder if you stand still long enough, commitment demands action. No one will hand it to you if you sit around and wait. Spiritual growth flows from commitment. After the apostle Paul explained to the Romans the concept of justification by faith, he told them their spiritual life rested on their identity in Christ. Paul revealed a great truth: as followers of Jesus our true identity rests in our sharing in his death, burial and resurrection (Romans 6).

Yet, we're rendered spiritually impotent if we lack commitment to God and our new and true identity. That's why Paul said, "Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God--this is your spiritual act of worship" (Romans 12:1). As followers of Jesus we must place all we have, and hope for, on an altar before God. Anything less leads to a small life . . . a life controlled by fear, our flesh and others, rather than God.

Fulfil Your Destiny
